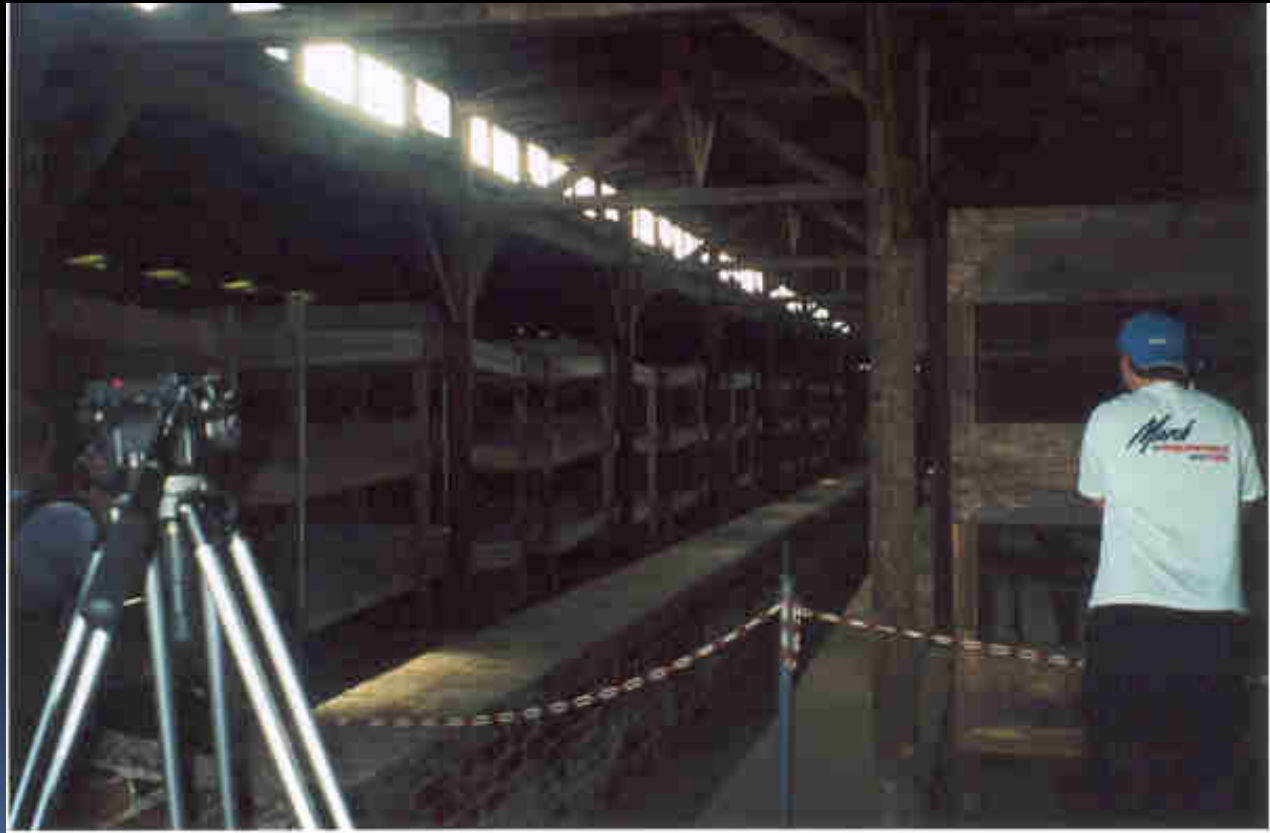

What is a Kapo?

- A Kapo was a concentration camp prisoner who cooperated with the Nazis to act as a police officer inside the camp. Even though they were prisoners themselves, they were given more food and other privileges. They were looked at as traitors, but at Auschwitz everyone did what he had to do to survive. Only a mean person would be selected by the Nazis to be a kapo.

Courtyard at Auschwitz

- This is where they were collected for roll call.
- This is where they hang the prisoners.
- There was no grass during WW2. The prisoners ate it.

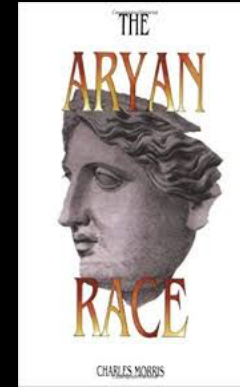


Buna

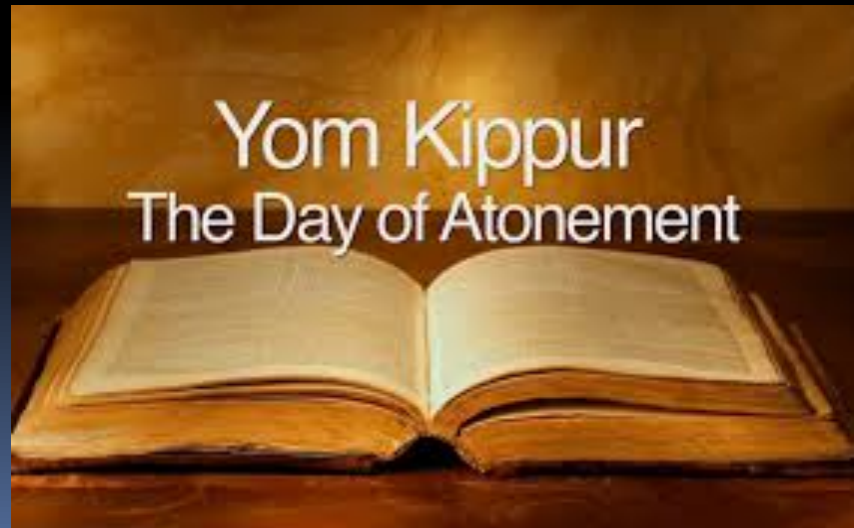
Rosh Hashanah



The Jewish New Year occurs in the fall. The Jewish calendar is not the same as the one we use. It is two days long and is both a time to rejoice about the past and think about the person you want to be in the future. It begins a holiday season that starts with Rosh Hashanah and ends with Yom Kippur.

Yom Kippur

- Yom Kippur is the Day of Atonement. It comes exactly 10 days after Rosh Hashanah. It is the day you're supposed to ask forgiveness for your sins. Many Jews fast on this day.



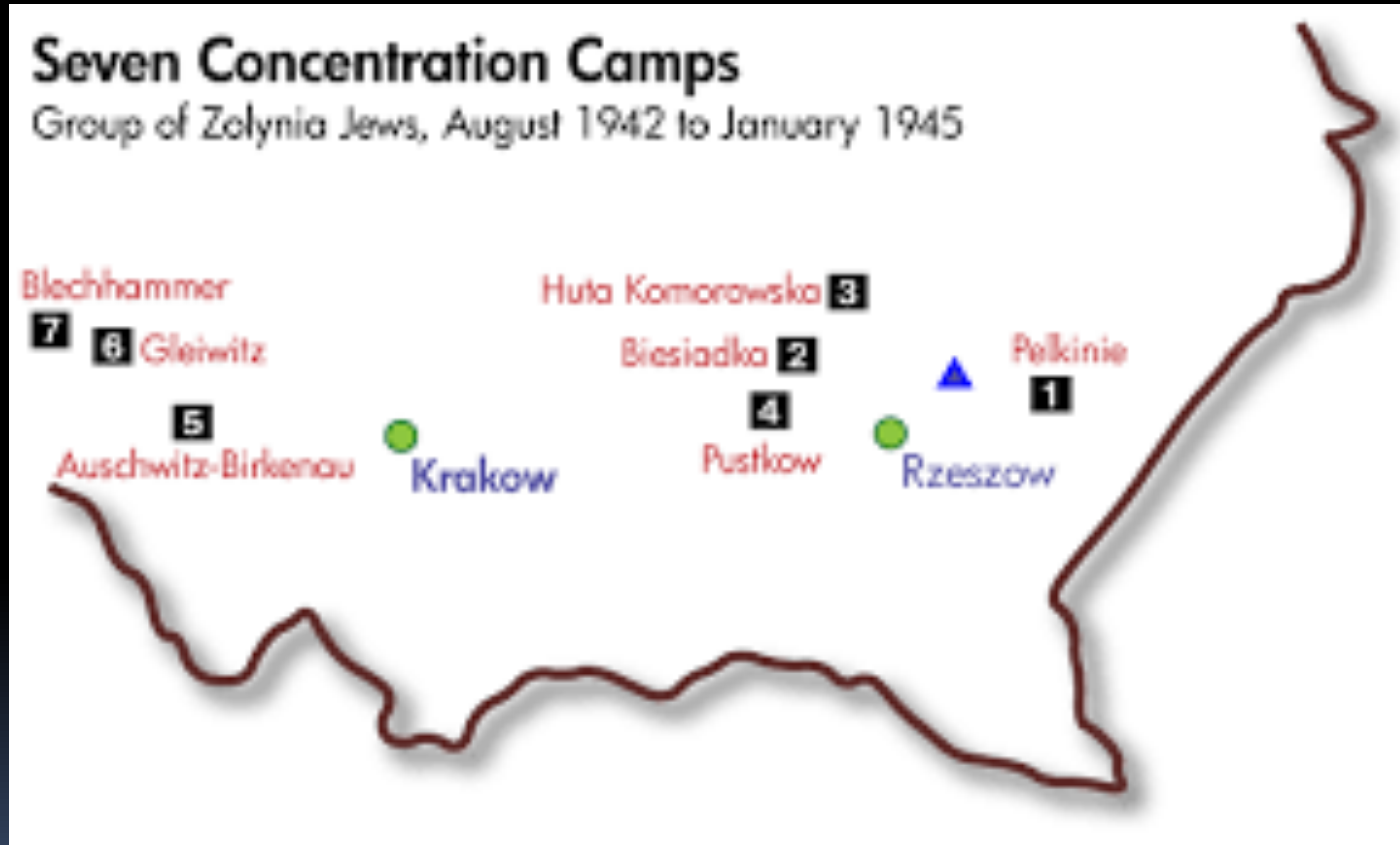
